Celebrating Difference

As you participate in building grammar skills, it won't be long before you realize that there are differences in the way we construct sentences to express our knowledge, ideas and feelings. That's because we first learn basic grammar before we come to school. When we come to school, we build on that knowledge as we learn to communicate with our peers. This is an opportunity for us to celebrate the differences as we create a shared means of communication. The key is to know the 'context' for our communication. Just like a story we consider: Who are the characters? What is being communicated, how and why?

Here's a series of flashcards that my students and I use to learn a few words from the language of the Yugambeh People, Traditional Custodians of the land surrounding our local area.
